

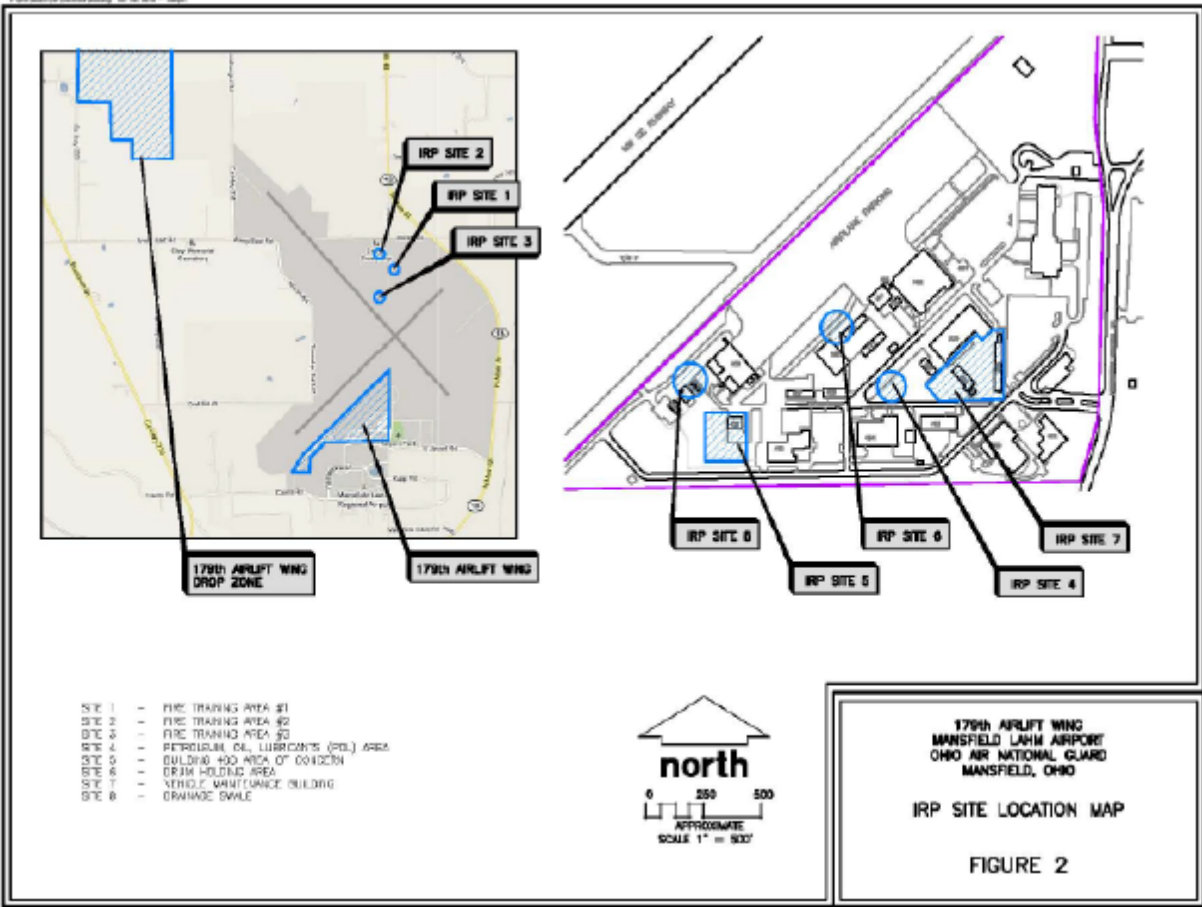
Installation Restoration Program (1988-2013):

The Environmental Restoration Program at the Ohio Air National Guard base in Mansfield has been conducted in three separate stages. In 1988, during stage 1, the program was called the Installation Restoration Program (IRP). The Installation Restoration Program at Mansfield Lahm ANGB focused on organics & heavy metal contamination in soil and groundwater based on past practices and began with a Preliminary Assessment from 1988 to 1989. At that time eight potential sites were identified for Site Investigation.

- Site 1 : Fire Training Area I
- Site 2: Fire Training Area 2
- Site 3: Fire Training Area 3
- Site 4: Petroleum, Oil, and Lubricants Facility
- Site 5: Building 400 Grounds
- Site 6: Drum Holding Area
- Site 7: Vehicle Maintenance Building 304
- Site 8: Drainage Swale Near Building 500

The Site Investigation, conducted from 1992 to 1997, recommended that all eight sites be further investigated. The Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study phase was conducted from 1999-2013. Based upon the information in the Remedial Investigation/Feasibility Study, a Record of Decision stating No Further Action was created and approved by the Ohio EPA. After an appropriate public comment period, the Air National Guard Installations and Mission Support Directorate published a Record of Decision declaring No further Action for all eight sites on March 20, 2013.

Please note that three of these sites; Fire Training Areas 1, 2, and 3 are on Mansfield Lahm Airport property, but not on the current Ohio Air National Guard leased property. Click on each site for a description of activities and results at each site.
